

# New POWER BOATS for 2017

## BRACEWELL

Bracewell's signature Pacesetter 540 has now been renamed the Bracewell 540 and the latest build was delivered to

its owner in Florida this past fall. The B.C.-based Bracewell Marine group has purchased the molds for the well-known Commander line and is modifying and updating the design and adding two new models to the classic 26- and 30-footers. The new, sleeker 26 will be on display at the Vancouver Boat show in January. It will be powered by a Hyundai SeaSall 270-horsepower diesel (a noteworthy new engine in our part of the world) with a Bravo 3 sterndrive. Under construction is a brand new, 34-foot Commander (top speed 35 knots) designed by well-known Naval Architect Ivan Erdevicki. A new 40 foot Commander is on the drawing board. The Commander line has been renamed Bracewell Commander.

Several years ago, Bracewell purchased the molds for the venerable Camano 41. It has been renamed the Bracewell 41 and one is currently under construction. It is a two-stateroom model and will be powered by a 480-horsepower Cummins diesel with a cruising speed of 11 knots and a top speed of 18 knots.
