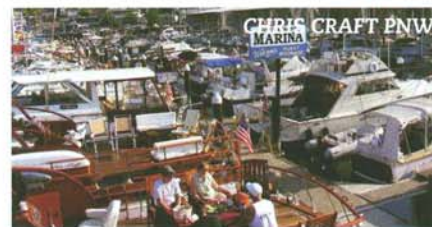


CHRIS CRAFT PNW
